

## Grade 8 Socials Studies Chapter 2 assignment The People Who Lived Here

Students must choose **one** of the following options:

- a) **Brochure**: You are working for The Rooms and have been asked to develop a brochure about European settlement in Newfoundland and Labrador. For the four European groups on pages 36 and 37, make a brochure that includes 1) What is their historical connection to our province? 2) What did they work at when they were here? 3) Where did they settle? Make sure to include pictures (ex. Flags) and use colour. Brochures will be graded on content, organization and attention to detail.
- b) **Diary Entry**: Pretend you are a new immigrant to Newfoundland and Labrador in the 1800s from one of the European groups on pages 36 and 37. Pick one of these groups and write a diary entry about your first few days in Newfoundland/Labrador. Your entry should include the connection of your group to this province, what you or your family worked at and where you and family members may have settled. Be creative and try to make the entry look old. Diary entries must be submitted on loose leaf or blank paper with your name on it. Make sure to date it with a date from the 1800s. Diaries will be graded on content, creativity and organization. ¾ page minimum. If using a computer, 12 point font maximum.
- c) **Slideshow**: You are working for the Department of Tourism and have been asked to develop a slideshow about European settlement in Newfoundland and Labrador to show people outside of Newfoundland and Labrador. For the four European groups on pages 36 and 37 develop a slideshow that includes 1) What is their historical connection to our province? 2) What did they work at when they were here? 3) Where did they settle? Make sure to include pictures (ex. Flags, places on a map where they settled etc.). Slideshows will be graded on content, organization, and overall presentation.
