Spring (Mar, Apr, May)	Fishing, farming, sealing
Summer (June, July, Aug)	Fishing , farming, gathering
Fall (Sept, Oct, Nov)	Fishing, farming, hunting, gathering

2. Why do you think wood would be cut mainly in the winter months?

3. Why is sealing mainly done in the spring?
